Day 1 ~ Sunday, June 8, 2025

Depart the United States flying overnight to Israel.

Day 2 ~ Monday, June 9, 2025

Tel Aviv

USA/Enroute

Welcome to Israel! Arrive Ben Gurion Airport. Individual transfers to **Tel Aviv**, Israel's most cosmopolitan city located on the Mediterranean Sea. Day at leisure.

Overnight: David Kempinski Hotel, Tel Aviv

Day 3 ~ Tuesday, June 10, 2025

Tel Aviv/Galilee

Group welcome breakfast. Begin the day with a unique journey through Tel Aviv, delving into its striking architecture and fascinating history. Gain fresh insights into the city's past and present through an engaging experience led by a knowledgeable local specialist. See the White City's most prominent Bauhaus buildings, built during the 1930's and the 1940's. See inside the city's street art and graffiti scene, which serves as a unique expression of the city's geographical location, cultural peculiarities, political movements, and the challenges faced since October 7th. Tel Aviv's street art tells a story, a multitude of stories, written on the city's walls and it often takes an expert to decipher. Explore the public plaza-turned-headquarters for the #BringThemHomeNow movement, born in the aftermath of Black Saturday. A public initiative, Hostages Square stands as a testament to the strength and solidarity of the people of Israel and should not be missed. Continue to ANU – Museum of the Jewish People, which represents all parts of the Jewish people and highlights the creative works and cultural riches of a variety of communities in different periods of history through state-of-the-art exhibits. End the day with a drive north, to the serene Mitzpe Hayamim Resort, nestled in the picturesque Galilean mountains, offering breathtaking views and a tranquil retreat. Dinner at hotel.

Day 4 ~ Wednesday, June 11, 2025

Galilee

Morning departure for **Safed**, center of **Jewish mysticism** with **historic synagogues** and **modern artists' quarter**. Roll up your sleeves and get hands-on in preparing a **BBQ lunch**, as you host **IDF soldiers** serving on the border. Meet **Ilan Shulman**, a **military intelligence analyst**, who specializes in the Middle East conflict and the global war on terrorists. **Jump into jeeps** for a **Northern Strategic tour** led by Ilan on to the **Golan Heights**, seeing the former Syrian fortifications and learning the key role this area is to Israel's safety. Dinner at hotel.

Overnight: Mitzpe Hayamim, Rosh Pina (B,L,D)

Day 5 ~ Thursday, June 12, 2025

Galilee/ Jerusalem

This morning, join the volunteer efforts to **rebuild a northern community evacuated during the war**, contributing to its restoration and renewal. Engage with local residents, hear their insights, and share in their hope for the future. Visit a **textile factory** in the **Druze Village of Yanuch**, and meet two sisters of recently fallen Druze soldiers. Enjoy **traditional Druze home hospitality and lunch** with a **local family** in Yanuch. Learn firsthand about the Druze community, their deep bond with, and commitment to, the State of Israel. Continue the journey up to Jerusalem, with a **special "She'hechiyanu"** upon arrival. Group dinner with **Lone Soliders**.

Day 6 ~ Friday, June 13, 2025

Jerusalem

Begin the day exploring Ir David, the City of David and the new excavations unfolding, including VIP access to the newly excavated Pilgrims Road (not yet available to the public) and the Pool of Siloam. Enter the walled old city through Dung Gate for a visit to the Davidson Center and Southern Wall Archeological Garden. Proceed to Ezrat Israel and spend time praying at the Kotel, Western Wall. Welcome Shabbat with Kehilat Yozma in the town of Modi'in, experiencing the warmth and spirit of community.

Day 7 ~ Saturday, June 14, 2025

Jerusalem

Morning speaker before embarking on a captivating **Shabbat Walking Tour** of **Jerusalem's Old City**, led by Lyana. Wander through the enchanting narrow alleys and scenic rooftops, discovering hidden gems and rich history along the way. The tour concludes with an exclusive visit to the newly opened **Tower of David Museum**, where you'll delve into Jerusalem's fascinating past through immersive exhibits and stunning views. **Shabbat concludes with Havdalah** together on the hotel's terrace. Enjoy the evening at leisure.

Day 8 ~ Sunday, June 15, 2025

Masada/Dead Sea/Jerusalem

Today begins with a meaningful visit to the **headquarters of ZAKA**, Israel's volunteer-based rescue and recovery organization. Gain unique insights into their vital humanitarian work, including emergency response, disaster victim identification, and ensuring dignity for the deceased. Engage with ZAKA representatives to hear inspiring stories of their dedication, resilience, and commitment to saving lives and supporting communities in times of crisis. Spend the rest of the day sightseeing in the **Israeli desert**. Drive to the shores of the **Dead Sea**, the lowest place on earth almost 1300 feet below sea level, for a **lunch & swim.** Continue to **Masada**, **ascending on the east side**, **by cable car**, to marvel at King Herod's desert fortress-palace and last stronghold of the Jewish zealots against the Roman domination in 73 CE. Return to Jerusalem for an evening at leisure. Optional evening tour of the **Western Wall Tunnels**.

Day 9 ~ Monday, June 16, 2025

Jerusalem

Share in a meaningful private escorted visit to **Yad Vashem**, Israel's official Holocaust museum, dedicated to the memory of the victims and honoring the survivors. Continue to the **Knesset**, Israel's parliament, for an insightful visit hosted by **MK Rabbi Gilad Kariv**. While at the Knesset, take a moment to admire the **Menorah**, which beautifully depicts Israel's rich history through the ages. End the day with a visit to the **National Library**, the newest state-of-the-art institution. Recongized with numerous awards, the National Library boasts unparalleled collections of ancient maps, rare books, original music recordings, ephemera, advertisements spanning various periods in Israeli history, and an extensive press archive.

Day 10 ~ Tuesday, June 17, 2025

Jerusalem

This morning, visit Netiv Ha'asara, a resilient community located on the border with Gaza, where you'll meet local residents and hear their powerful firsthand accounts of October 7. Gain deep insight into their experiences, strength, and unwavering resilience in the face of unimaginable adversity. From an overlook, take in a unique view of Gaza, offering a profound understanding of the recent events and their impact on the region. Next, continue to the town of Sderot and stop at the site of the Nova Music Festival, followed by a visit to Kibbutz Re'im. Explore the bomb shelter where Aner Shapira fought bravely and where Hersh Goldberg Polin was kidnapped. Visit Tekuma, where you'll see the haunting remains of the burnt cars from October 7, and conclude your journey at the lookout dedicated to the female surveillance soldiers who were tragically kidnapped into Gaza. The day culminates with a heartfelt dinner with the courageous reserve soldiers of Brothers for Life at their facility. Listen to their inspiring stories of dedication and sacrifice as we honor their bravery, dedication and sacrifice.
